From Our Mayor

I hope your summer was great and you had time to enjoy family and friends. The Township's summer camp and concert programs were another great success. The summer camp programs have grown considerably as a result of new and exciting activities. I thank all of those involved in Recreation for making our programs exciting as it is wonderful to see many parents and their families participate. I also thank Public Works for working hard outdoors in the heat and humidity planting flowers in the islands and all around the courtyard of the Municipal Building. The flags on the light poles in the Town Center look bright and it is good to see our town looking so patriotic!

The overlay program is now underway and we can all feel relief to drive on smooth solid roadways with the potholes being a thing of the past. We try to address every street in town but we must also remain within the constraints of our overlay budget. We have 325 streets in Warren Township and the worst streets take precedence; we ask for your continued patience. The Township Committee has increased expenditures for the overlay program in order to address as many roads as possible.

I would also like to thank our Wagner Farm Arboretum for the huge success of the Farmer's Market held on the Municipal grounds near the Library. If you have not been to this Market on Thursday afternoons you are missing out on wonderful fresh produce, local farm-made cheeses, homemade pickles, heat 'n serve frozen entrees, fresh flowers and more. I have been to the Market a number of times and know that the prices are good and the food is fresh.

The Planning Board is working on reviewing our Land Use Master Plan for all of Warren Township. This involves the re-examination of zoning districts to make sure they are still suitable with growth and changing times. Recommendations will be made to, and reviewed by, the Township Committee for their approval. The laws of New Jersey require a revision of the Master Plan every 10 years.

The Township Committee will be appointing a committee under the leadership of Committeeman Sordillo and Deputy Mayor Lazo to update the Master Plan for Wagner Farm.

We have been working consistently on the design; budget and plans for the New Municipal Building and bids were received in early July. We are hoping to put a shovel in the ground this fall. The Police Trailer has been demolished and the site for the new building is almost ready to begin construction. The Township Committee is mindful of the increase in cost estimates for this project and we have hired a Construction Management firm to insure the project is within budget and completed on time.

FLOOD DESIGNATION & ENGINEERING DEPT NEWS

As a result of the strong efforts of the Warren Township Engineering Department, the Township has been assigned to Class 8 of the National Flood Insurance Program Community Rating System, as developed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The Class 8 designation entitles Township residents in the Special Flood Hazard Area to a ten percent (10%) discount on their flood insurance premiums.

The Engineering Department has been actively involved in managing Township projects in 2015:

- Additional parking areas for the new Warren Township municipal facility are in the planning and design stage, with construction to commence soon.

Based on past experience with hurricane and winter storms in Warren, residents need to be prepared to shelter in place. That means you need to have supplies for your family for a minimum of three days and longer if possible. Some families in town keep two weeks of emergency supplies in a closet all year round. It's so simple. The time to make sure you have non-perishable food, water, flashlights and a battery operated radio is now.

During Hurricane Irene, the October Snow'ester, and Hurricane Sandy thousands of trees, and trees with power lines were down, blocking roads. By sheltering in place, residents can stay off the roads, allowing the Department of Public Works, utility crews, and first responders to do their jobs. Shelters and information centers will not open until roads are clear and supplies can move. Your safest bet is to stay home.

As with all big weather events, you are your family's first line of defense. "We strongly urge all households – in particular those with special needs or elderly members to have a disaster plan".

Think ahead. If you have a family member who needs oxygen, what's your plan? Do you have a generator with fuel to run the oxygen compressor? Or, can you stay with a friend or relatives outside of the area?" During an emergency, municipalities are responding to the disaster, and may not have resources to serve the needs of individuals who didn't plan. The New Jersey State Office of Emergency Website

- Improvements to Dead River Road, including regrading and repaving the roadway, are near design completion. This project is funded in part through a grant of \$175,000 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation. Completion is expected by the fall of 2015.
- The lighting fixture replacements, recently completed on Mountain Boulevard, have improved visibility for pedestrian and vehicular traffic while maintaining roadway aesthetics.

The Engineering Department reviews proposed project plans and participates in Planning Board and Board of Appeals monthly meetings to ensure that development in Warren Township complies with regulations.

HOME REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The Warren Township Committee offers a Housing Rehabilitation Program for residents who meet Affordable Housing guidelines for low and moderate incomes.

The program provides up to \$16,000 per dwelling for home improvements such as: new roof, electrical improvements, smoke detectors, etc. The funds are in the form of an interest free loan which is forgiven after a 10 year period. The loan must be repaid only if the property is sold within the 10 year period.

Halloween Safety Tips

I realize that I may be premature; however the Fall season is upon us and Halloween is quickly approaching. It was once dominated by children, but today Halloween has become much more of an adult social event. In recent years, Halloween has been celebrated with expensive house ornaments, adult parties featuring lavish costumes and of course many trick-or-treaters overwhelming some neighborhoods here in Warren. As with any house party you decide to host, we encourage residents to drink responsibly and make sure your guests plan to use a designated driver or car service.

Our busiest neighborhoods for children out trick-or-treating are Greenwood Meadows off Mt. Horeb Road and the Windemere development off Mountain Blvd. During the last few years, we've put our Bike Patrols in those residential areas as well as providing additional patrols throughout the township. The police department's utmost concern is for the safety and well-being of our residents.

A few safety tips to consider teaching your children prior to trick-or-treating:

- Walk safely- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street
- Always walk on sidewalks. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible
- Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach your children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars

A few safety tips for us adults too:

- Drive extra carefully on Halloween- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs
- Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings
- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways

Please make your payment in sufficient time to insure that it is received prior to the end of the grace period. Interest is calculated at 8% on delinquencies up to \$1,500.00 and at 18% on the amount over \$1,500.00. Once the balance is over the 18% threshold, interest will be 18% until all balances are paid in full.

There is a 6% year end penalty on taxes & accrued interest over \$10,000.00 that are delinquent as of December 31st.

As always you may pay your bill in person at the Municipal Building.

FREE Rabies Vaccination for Cats & Dogs

Middle-Brook Regional Health Commission will be sponsoring several rabies clinics in the fall in order to assure availability of free rabies vaccines for our cat and dog owners. Residents can bring their pets to any of the locations below. Cats must be transported in a carrier and all dogs must be leashed.

In addition, residents are reminded of these rabies prevention measures:

- Immediately report a bite from a wild or domestic animal to the local health department (*so post-exposure treatment can begin immediately if needed*)
- Immediately report any wild animal showing signs of unusual behavior
- Do not feed or handle wild animals
- Try to prevent your pets from coming into contact with wild animals
- Call the health department if you find a bat in your home
- Be sure all family pets and agricultural animals are up to date on their rabies vaccinations
- Screen off vents to attics and other areas that could provide shelter for bats
- Animal-proof home and yard
- Avoid contact with stray animals or pets other than your own

BILLING UPDATE

*****THE AUTHORITY HAS UPDATED ITS UTILITY BILLING SOFTWARE AND A NEWLY FORMATTED BILL WAS SENT OUT IN JANUARY FOR THE FULL YEAR. YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE ANOTHER BILL THIS YEAR.*****

The due dates for payment remain the same – February 1, May 1, August 1 and November 1 - with a ten day grace period until the 10th of each respective month.

To avoid having your sewer payments mistakenly applied to your property taxes, do not send your payments to the lock box address that is used only for property taxes. Instead, please be sure to send sewer payments directly to: Warren Township Sewerage Authority, 46 Mountain Blvd., Warren, New Jersey 07059

While the Authority does not accept credit cards, you can streamline your bill payment by adding us to your online bank account bill payment feature. **Please Include your account number on your checks.**

Please note that in January 2016 you will be receiving your annual sewer service bill which will include ALL FOUR QUARTERS and a stub for each. As always you can pay each quarter individually or the total bill in January.

REMINDERS

It is illegal to have your sump pump or your roof leaders attached to your sewer line. The reason behind this prohibition is the extra water increases inflow into the treatment plants, especially during times of heavy rain and storms. This inflow of what is otherwise clean water can effect the operation of the plants, as it introduces higher volumes of water than the plants are designed to treat. At the time of publication of this newsletter the Authority is actively looking into the collection system inspecting sewer lines and manholes for infiltration of water. Once these areas are identified they will then be repaired so no extraneous flow can enter the sanitary sewer system.

In order to maintain the integrity of the collection system, the Authority asks that certain materials are not flushed or poured down the drain, as they can get tangled in the systems screens, or in your sewer lateral located on your property, which can cause a back up into your home, or otherwise cause problems at the treatment plants. These materials include:

- ♦ Any types of handy wipes or paper towels
- ♦ Feminine hygiene products (all types)
- ♦ Paint, primer and solvents
- ♦ Construction materials
- ♦ Rags and other cloth
- ♦ Duct tape, athletic tape, and other adhesive tapes
- ♦ Dental floss
- ♦ Cooking grease or any type of cooking oils

EMERGENCIES

The Sewerage Authority operates three treatment plants and 19 pumping stations located throughout Warren, our licensed operators are available and on call 24/7. If you have a sewer emergency during business hours, please contact us at 908 753-8000. Should you have a sewer emergency after office hours, please call the Warren Township Police Department at 908 753-1000, and they will alert our on-call operator.

SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings. You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.

As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

- ♦ Properly Use And Dispose Of Hazardous Products
- ♦ Keep Pollution Out Of Storm Drains
- ♦ Don't Litter
- ♦ Clean Up After Your Pet
- ♦ Don't Feed Wildlife
- ♦ Dispose Of Yard Waste Properly
- ♦ Limit Your Use Of Fertilizers And Pesticides

Leaves will soon begin to change color and fall onto the ground. It is against the law and extremely important not to blow leaves or any other debris into the street, storm drains, or catch basins. When leaves and debris cover the catch basins or clog the drains, water drainage issues and/or flooding may occur.



You may drop off your Christmas trees up until January 15, 2016. Please place them next to the side of the parking lot just outside of the DPW gate. Make sure all decorations are removed. Enjoy the season!

We are quickly approaching the winter season which means snow. As usual, the Department of Public Works will be keeping a very sharp eye on the weather and will respond accordingly. Just a few tips on how to minimize the discomfort of snow and ice:

- All ice and snow shall be removed from sidewalks by the owner or tenant of lands abutting, bordering or adjoining public streets of the township, or public streets of the County of Somerset, within 12 hours of daylight after such ice has formed or snow has fallen, or as soon thereafter as practicable.
- If you must shovel snow, please do so in moderation.
- *****DO NOT have your driveway plowed out before the end of the storm and before your road has been plowed.*****
- If you clean your driveway before the road is plowed (curb to curb) you risk having it closed up again by a snow plow.
- Don't be surprised if one side of your road is plowed and the other side is not plowed until a considerable time later. This is done per plan and is a way to plow the route in the shortest possible time.
- Make certain that you keep all vehicles off the road when snow is expected.
- If you park your vehicle at the end of your driveway, when snow is expected, make certain that the nose of your vehicle is back far enough so that it does not interfere with the plows.
- After the snow, make certain that your vehicle is properly equipped for driving in winter conditions.
