From Our Mayor

Dear Warren Residents and Neighbors,

First of all, I want to thank Committeeman Gary DiNardo for his leadership in 2014. His guidance and dedication to the Township and its residents has been unwavering and steadfast. I also thank my colleagues on the Township Committee for their dedication and hard work.

The year of 2014 was a time for freshness and growth in the Township. In April, the Township entered into a joint management agreement to develop, manage and maintain a loop trail at the East County Park, which is bordered by Dubois, Reinman and Old Stirling Roads. The Board of Chosen Freeholders, Township Committee and County Park Commission agreed to jointly undertake the development of walking trails and other amenities at the 150-acre park, which officially opened on September 10, 2014. The current program proposes a network of multi-use trails throughout the park that will connect the existing uses to make more of the park accessible to the public. In case you haven't been there, this area is one of the most picturesque pieces of property in the Township, as it represents the Township's rural heritage.

As you have probably noticed, in July 2014, Warren Township introduced a brand new website. The website is more user-friendly, easier to navigate and is less cumbersome. You can find the website at: warrennj.org.

In October, Warren Township was certified as a Sustainable Jersey Silver Municipality through the efforts of our Green Team. This award was the result of providing Warren Township with Community Education, Outreach and Education for Sustainability Programs just to name a few.

Warren also received the 2014 Sustainable Jersey Creativity Award (one of 3 annual special awards given to municipalities in NJ) as a result of the work of the Utility Advisory Committee.

In 2014, the Township received a Triple A Bond Rating from Standard and Poor's which recognizes the quality of our businesses and our residential community as well as our sound financial practices.

The Township continues to work with commercial property owners to assist them in renting vacant space. In 2014 the Township extended the Economic Incentive Ordinance (No. 14-16), which waives up to \$5,000 in construction permit fees for projects that create 5 or more new positions.

As I drove around town this holiday season, the banners and tinsel on the poles of the street lights along Mountain Boulevard reminded us of the season and generated a holiday spirit in our community. In addition, the Municipal Complex was decorated with a Christmas tree, lights around the buildings and six white reindeer placed on the front lawn of the municipal building. There was a Hanukkah Menorah placed within the Municipal Complex that was lit on the first day of Hanukkah and the seven days thereafter. Our Town Center truly was beautiful this holiday season.

In mid-2015, the Township will plan to begin construction on the new municipal building. The new building will be constructed and connected to the Police and Court building and will house Township Departments on the first and second floors, training and locker rooms for the Police, and meeting spaces. The current building is over 100 years old and its charm and history will remain intact.

The Township Committee also plans to commence construction of a 4,500 square foot building at the Wagner Farm. This building will provide space for the Wagner Farm Arboretum, Recreation, and other Township Departments that benefit our residents.

The year 2015 plans to be yet another exciting year in Warren Township. On behalf of the entire Township Committee, I wish all of our residents and businesses a healthy and prosperous New Year.

The Warren Township school district is pleased to have received a total of seven ROD (Regular Operating District) grants which enable the district to secure State funding in the amount of 40%, for a variety of facilities projects: building façade renovations, window replacements, a partial roof replacement and a boiler replacement.

The district is working in conjunction with USA Architects on all of the projects. Additionally, Warren Township Schools' Supervisor of Buildings & Grounds, Tyler Tribelhorn, diligently oversees each project and is always on hand to troubleshoot as needed.

The three building façade renovations are at the following locations: Angelo L. Tomaso School, Mt. Horeb School, and Woodland School. The work is being executed by Three Sons Restoration with special attention to minute details. Each project is proceeding smoothly. The construction budget for the building façade renovations came in at 11% under budget, for a total construction cost of \$434,000.

The window replacement projects are occurring at Mt. Horeb School and Warren Middle School. The work for these projects was awarded to D&E Windows. Installation at Warren Middle School is in its final stages, and progress at Mt. Horeb School is on target, according to schedule. These window projects replace windows ranging from 40 to 50 years old. In order to facilitate a tighter timeline and realize a maximum savings, work is completed after hours. This benefits the community by eliminating the upcharge that naturally occurs with summer work. The original construction budget of 1.65 million dollars, came in at slightly under 1.1 million dollars, a healthy 33% below budget.

The district had a new boiler installed at Central School through Kelin Heating. Thanks to Tyler Tribelhorn, the project was structured in such a way that installation did not impact heating the school. Through the use of a cooperative purchasing bid, the cost of the boiler replacement project was nearly cut in half. With a budget of \$329,400, the project is slated to be completed at a cost of \$178,406.

Lastly, the roof replacement project at Mt. Horeb School is being executed by VMG. The majority of the current roof was installed in 1997, with the remainder installed at the time of the 2001 addition. The actual construction cost for this project came in a full 23% lower than the budgeted 2.1 million dollars.

Please make your payment in sufficient time to insure that it is received prior to the end of the grace period. Interest is calculated at 8% on delinquencies up to \$1,500.00 and at 18% on the amount over \$1,500.00. Once the balance is over the 18% threshold, interest will be 18% until all balances are paid in full.

There is a 6% year end penalty on taxes & accrued interest over \$10,000.00 that are delinquent as of December 31st.

Distracted Driving

In today's world there are distractions all around us. Many things tend to take our attention away from the road, such as, talking on the phone or to a passenger, texting, eating, looking after children or reading a map. Although all of these distractions are dangerous, "text messaging while driving" creates a crash risk 23 times higher than driving while not distracted according to the United States Department of Transportation. Multiple studies concluded that using a wireless communications device while driving is the most significant distraction that affects driving performance.

Distractions from cell phones and texting are especially significant for teen drivers. Teens are the less experienced drivers and also the group most likely to use a cell phone and particularly, text while driving. Distractions now join alcohol and speeding as leading factors in fatal and serious injury crashes.

We all have a stake in solving this problem, and we can all be a part of the solution. We must put our phones down; be a good example to our children, peers, and community. Kids learn from their parents. Put down your phone while driving and only use it when you've safely pulled off the roadway. As parents, we need to discuss the risk responsibilities of driving, and the danger of dividing their attention between a cell phone and the road.

In Warren Township, the police officers frequently conduct specific "traffic enforcement", targeting violators as part of the "Put It Down" Somerset County's Distracted Driving Initiative. Since this initiative began in 2012, the Warren Police have issued several hundred summonses relating to cell phone violations. To date, the Warren Police Department has seen a 42% increase in cell phone violation summonses over this three year period.

The Warren Police Department will not tolerate distracted driving and will continue taking affirmative steps to enforce this initiative.

REPORTING PROBLEMS:

Call us to report overgrown vegetation, missing street signs, etc., or with any questions. Pot holes and sink holes can happen quickly. Notify us if you see any. Remember pot holes and sink holes cannot be repaired in extreme cold temperatures. Report any water drainage problems. Many times, drainage problems are because the catch basins or gutters are clogged with leaves. It is against the New Jersey Clean Water Act Rules to throw anything into the catch basins or in the streets.

BILLING UPDATE

The Authority has updated its utility billing software and a newly formatted bill was sent out in January for the full year. The due dates for payment remain the same – February 1, May 1, August 1 and November 1 - with a ten day grace period until the 10th of each respective month. To avoid having your sewer payments mistakenly applied to your property taxes, do not send your payments to the lock box address that is used only for property taxes. Instead, please be sure to send sewer payments directly to:

While the Authority does not accept credit cards, you can streamline your bill payment by adding us to your online bank account bill payment feature.

REMINDERS

It is illegal to have your sump pump or your roof leaders attached to your sewer line. The reason behind this prohibition is the extra water increases inflow into the treatment plants, especially during times of heavy rain and storms. This inflow of what is otherwise clean water can affect the operation of the plants, as it introduces higher volumes of water than the plants are designed to treat.

In order to maintain the integrity of the collection system, the Authority asks that certain materials are not flushed or poured down the drain, as they can get tangled in the systems screens, or in your sewer lateral located on your property, which can cause a backup into your home, or otherwise cause problems at the treatment plants. These materials include:

any types of handy wipes or paper towels
feminine hygiene products
paint, primer and solvents
construction material

rags and other cloth
duct tape, athletic tape, and other adhesive tapes
dental floss
cooking grease or any type of cooking oils

EMERGENCIES

The Sewerage Authority has three treatment plants and 19 pumping stations located throughout Warren, and our licensed operators are available and on call 24/7. If you have a sewer emergency during business hours, please contact us at 908 753-8000 ext. 258. **Should you have a sewer emergency after office hours, please call the Warren Township Police Department at 908 753-1000, and they will alert our on-call operator.**

**Wagner Farm Arboretum Celebrates 10 Years
of Conservation and Education**

WFA celebrated its 10th Anniversary in July 2014 and there is a lot to be proud about. Ten years ago all we had was some old farm buildings and vacant land. One of the most successful accomplishments is the Community Garden. A major component of which is the Giving Garden that in 2014 produced over 35,000 pounds of food which was donated to local area food banks and shelters. Six thousand pounds of that food came from the WFA garden. The WFA Community Garden has 120 plots and is organic. Many of the people that participate in this garden tell us that much of this produce is for local tables which help to educate the community in the importance of growing organic food.

2014 has also seen progress on replacing the barn and the shed between the two old silos. We hope to see construction start this summer and have it ready by Brite Nites. Also, when that is completed we will start the building of the Butterfly Conservatory adjacent to the new building.

This year we plan to focus on the gardens around the grounds. In the back of the lot where the children’s garden has been the only attraction, sixty trees were planted inside the fenced area to create a Tree Alley. There are plans to add a few additional garden spots – yet to be determined but one could be a Zen Garden, a handicap accessible garden, or even a fish pond.

After a challenging 2014 WFA is looking forward to a terrific 2015.

RABIES CLINIC

The Middle-Brook Regional Health Commission, with the Warren Township Board of Health, will be offering one rabies clinic this spring. All residents are encouraged to have their dog or cat vaccinated against rabies. Rabies has already been identified in the state and several cases were identified last year in the towns of the Commission.
