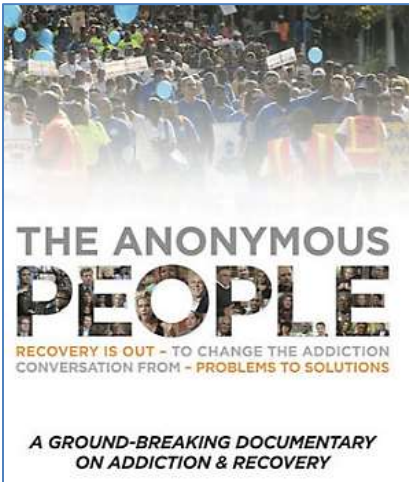


March 6, 2017 Watchung Hills Regional Municipal Alliance - Press Release
