



Warren Officials Work to Restore Power

August 7, 2020

The Township Committee is providing this daily update as to the restoration of power in Warren Township. The Warren Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and the Warren Police Department are working with JCP&L and our Somerset County partners.

- Mt. Bethel Road and Mt. Horeb Road opened to the public at 3:00 p.m. when JCP&L completed the restoration.
- Mt. Horeb Road and Skyline Drive were temporarily repaired by JCP&L on Thursday; however, the temporary fix failed. Unfortunately, at 11:30 a.m. today, a truck driving down Mt. Horeb Road drove through low hanging wires and snapped the pole while taking down all the wires. This will require a significant restoration. Mt. Horeb Road is closed as a result. To the best of the Township's knowledge, this outage is affecting portions of Greenwood Meadows, the Mt. Horeb Road area, and neighboring streets.
- JCP&L estimates that the circuit serving King George Road, south of Mountainview Road will be returned to operation by 11:30 p.m. this evening.
- JCP&L crews and their contractors have been observed in Warren Township, and are actively investigating the damages that are causing the outages.
- The Warren Police Department is surveying damages to identify outages and report them to JCP&L.
- Residents are reminded to report your outage to JCP&L to ensure that their information is accurate. Township officials cannot lobby on your behalf with the power company unless you have reported your outage. Please help us help you.
- JCP&L has arranged free ice and water to be available to their customers at the Kings Supermarket.
- Mayor Mick Marion has contacted the JCP&L government liaisons to ensure that Warren is not overlooked and that power is restored on an expeditious basis.

The Township Committee continues to fight for the residents and businesses of Warren to ensure a return of electricity to our community.
